Sustainable Pacific Grove *by Ken Morley* What is Sustainable Pacific Grove?

The concept for Sustainable Pacific Grove is: to gain an understanding of what Pacific Grove residents and businesses will need once cheap oil is no longer readily available; to define strategic responses that can be taken locally; and to undertake projects that will help the City, its residents, and businesses become more self reliant and sustainable.

In recent months, many communities throughout the United States have begun to develop "localization" programs to promote lower consumption of oil, greater local self-reliance, and more cooperative and inclusive communities. These communities have recognized that local efforts will be needed to prepare for the end of low cost gasoline and natural gas. Since fossil fuels are required to transport almost everything we use and eat as well as needed to produce these items, the upward raise in the cost of fuel will have broad consequences for all Americans. Communities that begin planning for these changes through creating local support networks will be best prepared to help address the coming impacts of rising prices and shortages.
