THE LAKE

The Lake Committee

This past January and February, the lake was partially drained to restore 200 feet of badly eroded lake bank using rock, soil, and cement. The area that was reconstructed ran from the spillway by #110 to below #96. We also did some more planting around the lake to retain soil on the slopes and lake banks, and to add more color and beauty to our surroundings.

Plants that were recently planted around the lake and lake slopes are drought-tolerant. In all of those areas, there are no sprinklers. Therefore the plant must develop a root system that will be able to seek water deep in the soil. In their first year only, the plants will be deep soaked once a week by the gardeners. Infrequent deep watering will cause their roots to grow down to search for moisture. After one year of weekly soakings, the plants will be able to survive on their own. If a young plant is watered too often, its roots will spread out just below the surface of the ground and it will not be able to survive without ongoing watering.

BOARD NEWS

Last September, the Board reduced the monthly dues to 305 per month per unit effective 11/1/07. In November, Betty Lauritsen, Marcia Scala, and Nancy Budd were elected to the three vacant director positions on the Board. With respect to the officer positions, Grossman was elected President, Lauritsen Vice-President, Axt Treasurer, Scala Secretary, and Budd Member at Large. In January, the Board agreed that 62.5% or \$190.63 of our monthly dues of \$305 would go towards the Operating Budget and the balance of our dues (\$114.37) would go into the Reserve Account. We are still waiting for our CPA to complete his audit of our financial records. The audit will be distributed as soon as possible. Copies of minutes, financial records, governing documents, and other items of interest are all posted on the website.

The next board meeting will be on Tuesday, April 15th at 6 PM. We will meet at 92 Glen Lake Dr. Thank you Lynn for opening your home for us. All are welcome to attend.
