GREEN YARD WASTE CONTAINERS

About 8 years ago, Waste Management switched from the small recycle bins to the one large green recycling container. At the same time, they added the large green yard waste containers. It seemed too much for everyone to have 3 containers in their garage, so as a convenience to all, several containers were placed behind some of the one story garages to use for yard waste. Our previous gardeners also used these containers and were here early enough on Wednesdays to place them at the street. Our current gardeners do not use these. If you use one for your patio trimmings, please place the container at the street on the next Tuesday evening as this pick up is before 8 AM, and then return it Wednesday after pickup. This task is not a board member responsibility. If you use it, then you must move it. Also, these containers are clearly marked for yard waste. They may not contain any other items and yard clippings cannot be in plastic bags.
