SOLAR TUBES

If you have been thinking about installing any solar tubes, now is the time to do it and you must act quickly. The roofers have agreed to install them as they put on the new roofs. The association will pay the roofers, and each unit will then reimburse the association for any tubes they had installed.

Please ask Ken Morley #86, Chuck Adams #3, or Nancy Budd #26 to see one already installed.

The benefit in having them done by the roofing company is that they will be responsible for the installation and any possible roof leaks. If you do it later with your own contractor, you will be responsible for any roof problems.

Architectural Control request forms must be submitted to Ken Morley (architectural control) or put in the Glen mailbox (1 Glen Lake Drive, across from unit #100) by July ^{1st}. More then one solar tube for a unit may be requested on one form. The form is available on The Glen web site or from Ken.
